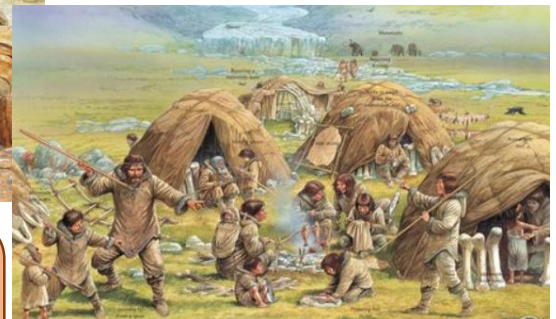
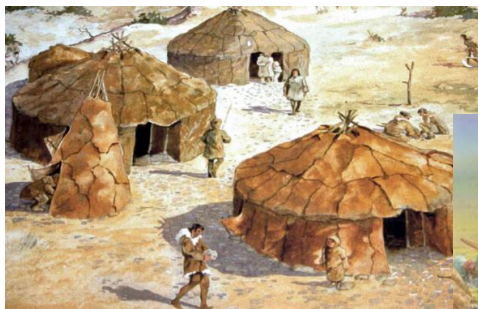

Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages

This term, we are HISTORIANS! We will begin by learning what we mean by 'prehistory'. There were no written records at this time (before the Roman arrival) so historians must examine physical artefacts such as the remains of buildings and tools, to learn about history. We will first look at the people of the early Stone Age before discovering the impact of agriculture during the Neolithic period. We will then look at the changes brought by the use of metals such as bronze during the Bronze Age and iron in the Iron Age. After studying the three ages of prehistory, we will investigate Stonehenge and discover what it tells us about the people who once lived in prehistoric Britain.

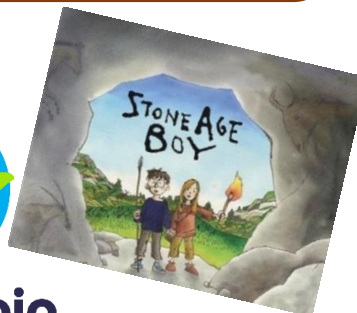
